Their daughters were in 4-H, and the family raised three guide dogs for the blind. Sheila and Patrick went to Lourdes, France; Fatima, Portugal and Medjagorje, Yugoslavia. They also enjoyed cruises, touring Europe and relaxing at Lake Tahoe. The Kellys have three children and three grandchildren and moved to SRC for its guiet location and park-like setting.
