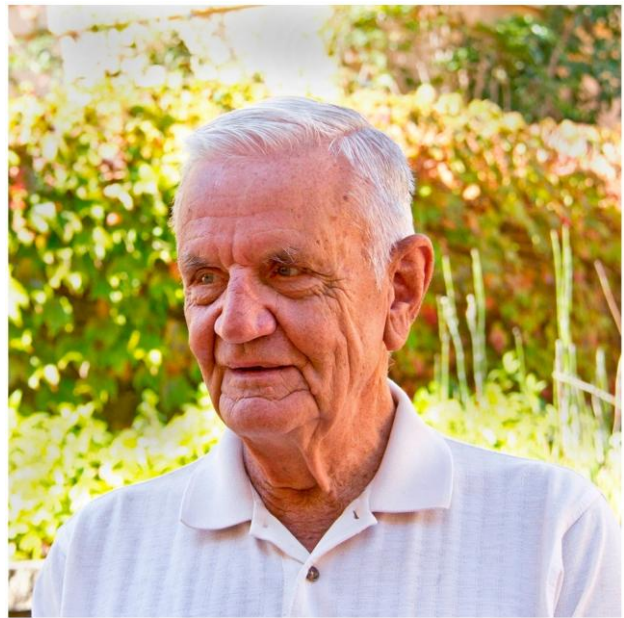

They then moved to Schenectady, NY, Philadelphia, PA and finally to San Jose, and lived in the Almaden area for 38 years prior to coming to SRC. Pat's hobbies are gardening and golf. She has been scoring for the AT&T tournament at Pebble Beach since 1998. Pat has been active in AAUW, League of Women Voters, Red Cross and Good Samaritan Hospital where she was president of the Auxiliary. She was also president of the Central California County Volunteer Council and director of the Women's Golf Association of Northern California.
