

Dr. John Watson-Williams May 25, 1926 to August 16, 2021

Dr. John Watson-Williams was born in Bristol, England, and trained as a medical doctor at Cambridge, Bristol, Sheffield, Cardiff and Edinburgh. His hyphenated name comes from a long line of ancestors who were doctors and merchants. His field of specialty was hematology (the science of blood) in which he has published more than 60 papers and has received patents and awards. He has spent a total of 20 years living in Africa (Uganda, Nigeria, Zambia). Nigeria is where he met his late wife, Margaret, who was a medical missionary. They had three children. He came to the US in 1969, first to New York, then as a professor at UC Davis from 1972-1988.

He and his wife lived in Carmel before moving to SRC where she died in 2005. He is active locally in his church and still volunteers his medical expertise and his wit in projects here and worldwide.
