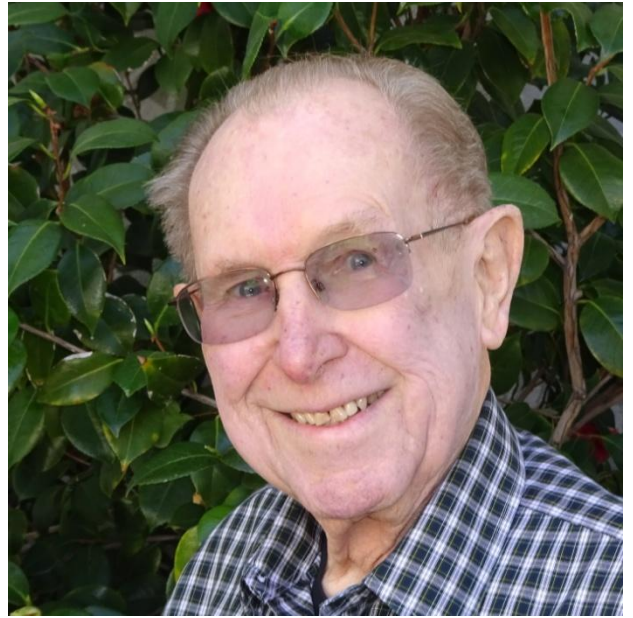




Pat Busch
