Carl was born and raised in San Jose and graduated from San Jose State with a degree in law enforcement. He was a pitcher on the San Jose State baseball team when there were 4,000 students and tuition was \$9 per quarter. In WWII he served in the Second Infantry Division, landing on Omaha Beach on D-Day. On his return, he went to work for Pacific Telephone, starting by climbing poles and retiring after 38 years as vice-president for marketing.

Carl met his wife Betty at San Jose State and they were married six weeks before he left for war and was gone two years. They have one son, three grandsons, one great grandson and one great granddaughter. Carl's work with the phone company took them to New York City, Sacramento, San Francisco, Palo Alto and San Jose. After retirement they lived in Santa Rosa during the summers and wintered in Palm Desert where they played golf.

Carl served on the Santa Clara County Grand Jury and as a volunteer for the Red Cross and for Guide Dogs for the Blind. Carl and Betty doted on Corgi dogs. In 1975 he was named by the San Jose Mercury News as one of the ten most successful graduates of San Jose State University.
