

Norman Gould April 23, 1924 - June 25, 2012

Norman was born and raised in Boston, MA. He graduated from Boston Public Latin School, the oldest high school in the Western Hemisphere, established in 1635. His education took him to various universities in Michigan, Colorado, Oklahoma, and ultimately to the University of Tennessee, where he earned his M.D. He joined the Navy as a medical intern in Long Beach, CA and later served as the medical officer on a ship. His residency was in pediatrics at the University of Pennsylvania. After 20 years in private practice as a pediatrician in Santa Clara, CA he joined the Santa Clara Valley Medical Center, devoting most of his time to teaching. In 1987 as a clinical professor at Stanford, he won the Henry J. Kaiser Teaching Award.

Norm enjoyed tennis, skiing, and traveling; his favorite trip was a barge trip in France. He and his wife, May, had three children. They lived in Saratoga for 47 years before moving to SRC on December 28, 2004.

May passed away on January 28, 2006
