



Jack Harriman

March 6, 1921 - November 30, 2006

Jack was born in Salt Lake City and then moved at an early age to Palo Alto, where he grew up and received all of his education. After graduating from Stanford, he served three years in the Army Ordnance Dept. as a Proof Officer in the R&D Center at Aberdeen Proving Ground. Jack then returned for graduate studies at Stanford and received his PhD in physics before joining the GE Nuclear Energy Division in San Jose, where he then spent most of his professional career. From developing computer programs for nuclear reactor design, he branched into computer programming management, and for the last fifteen years before retirement, was manager of computations and information systems.

He, his late wife and two children lived in Los Gatos for many years. Jack has visited 34 countries, but his perennial favorite is the whole of Britain, his exploring of which has required 11 summer vacations. But Bali, Indonesia, still stands out as a most unique and appealing destination for its natural beauty and the fascinating customs of its people.

Jack passed away on November 30, 2006.
